The bill somewhat dillutes the standing notion of "probable cause".</p> <p>Vote to invoke cloture on an amendment to HR 2578 that authorizes the attorney general to deny the transfer of a firearm to a known or suspected terrorist.</p>	<p>Cloture Not Invoked (Senate) (47-53) Put forth by Dianne Feinstein, D-Calif.</p>
